What have I been doing since high school?

I met my future husband (Nicky Dunlop '67 CHS graduate) in the summer of 1968 at the "little sandpits" in Channelview. We dated for a couple of years and married June 5, 1970. After graduation from High School, I went to Southwestern Business College for one year and went to work for Weingarten's as an executive secretary. I always wanted to be a secretary, don't know why, but that was always a big dream of mine. After we had our first child September 2, 1974 (Nicki), I stayed home for a while and then went back to work. I worked at Proler International as an executive secretary to a vice president and then the president of the company. Then on October 9, 1979, I went to work for Aramco Services Company. When I first joined the company, I worked in the finance department, then after eight months was promoted to buyer assistance/expeditor. Worked in this area for eighteen years, then promoted to the Career Development Department as an IR (Industrial relations) Assistant. As this is a Saudi company, we bring Saudi's here to the United States and Canada to better their education. I work with doctors, dentists and some students. The doctors/dentists are brought here for a period of four to six years for subspecialties in the area of their profession. We also bring students who just finished high school here for their college education. I am responsible for about 60-80 of the Saudi's. I get to travel here in the states and Canada to meet the students.

Our daughter Nicki graduated from Texas A&M in 1996 where she met her future husband Kevin McDonald, who graduated in 1997. Nicki and Kevin married February 1996. They now live in Keller, Texas, where she is director of the children's department in her church and Kevin works for Microsoft in Dallas. We moved to Baytown, Texas in 1981. My husband retired in February of this year and if all goes well I will retire in April of 2007.
